The school also boasts a comprehensive counseling program; a broad range of courses; services for students whose first language is not English; a talented and gifted program; honors options; a student leadership program; and special education services. Most MNOHS courses are NCAA approved.

"This accreditation, and the commendations, is a badge of honor for the entire MNOHS community," remarked MNOHS Executive Director Elissa Raffa. "As we look to the future of education, MNOHS provides a model of what creative, connected online learning can and should be."

MNOHS is a state-certified Online Learning Provider and public charter school, accountable to the Minnesota Department of Education. MNOHS' charter school authorizer is Pillsbury United Communities. All MNOHS teachers hold Minnesota licenses for the content areas in which they teach. Ms. Raffa is licensed in Minnesota as a district superintendent and as a secondary science teacher.
